



#### **Patient Safety Culture**





The Theme of the Workshop was Patient Safety Culture and it was facilitated by Mr. Stephen Powell, who is the Principal and Managing Partner of the Healthcare Team Training Ltd, Atlanta, USA.

Over 60 people attended the Workshop and the attendance cut across stakeholders in the Healthcare Industry including medical practitioners, nurses, pharmacists, clinicians, laboratory technicians, Hospital and Healthcare personnel, researchers, students and members of the society. It was an avenue for learning and sharing of issues pertaining to healthcare quality in Nigeria.

## Poster Accepted at ISQUA

- Poster "Building up the quality Mind set in the Nigerian Healthcare Sector" presented at ISQua conference October 21st - 24th 2012 in Geneva.
- Categorized in a new for "transitional and developing countries" with several presentations from other African countries.
- Over 1200 people from 70 countries attended, including 4 NHIS staff who attended with keen interest for accreditation information.

- Represented by Dr. Tayo Bello, SQHN Board Member
- Interest around SQHN during the workshop due to it non governmental and not for profit status







## **Accreditation**

- The Society continues to strongly advocate accreditation as a means to quality improvement.
- In 2009, the Society signed an agency agreement with COHSASA (Council for Health Service Accreditation of Southern Africa) to promote accreditation of healthcare facilities in Nigeria.
- The Society subsequently facilitated the collaboration between JCI, COHSASA & PharmAccess to form Safe Care, an accreditation platform for small & medium sized healthcare providers in resource poor settings.
- Safe Care has been introduced to several clinics in Nigeria as a step towards the accreditation process.
- The Society aims to create more awareness about benefits of accreditation through its seminars and conferences
